Dear Members and other Friends:

The other day I saw a wonderful meme on Facebook:

I know this is Lent,
but I never expected
I would have to
give this much up!

By the time you read this, you will probably have given up more for Lent than you ever expected. The Coronavirus Pandemic has literally forced us to give up some things that are precious to us.

- Some have had to go without eating out in restaurants.
- Others have had vacations and other travel cancelled.
- Children have been forced to give up their daily school lessons taught by a teacher who was right there and available to them to answer questions.
- Some have been forced to give up hobbies.
- Others have had to give up meeting with groups that are essential to their emotional health and well-being, even if some might just describe it as just an exercise class or just a card group.
- Many have had to give up church activities and probably most difficult of all corporate worship on Sunday mornings.
- People have had to give up personally being with loved ones who are in Nursing Homes, Rehab Centers and maybe most challenging, not visiting loved ones in the hospital.

One of the most poignant passages of Scripture that points to how we are called to live out the calling to live a life in Christ is Philippians 2. It speaks directly about that which we are asked to give up in the new life in Christ following after the example of Christ himself:

If then there is any encouragement in Christ, any consolation from love, any sharing in the Spirit, any compassion and sympathy, ² make my joy complete: be of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. ³ Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. ⁴ Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others. ⁵ Let the same mind be in you that was^[a] in Christ Jesus,

*⁶ who, though he was in the form of God,
did not regard equality with God
as something to be exploited,*

⁷ *but emptied himself,
taking the form of a slave,
being born in human likeness.
And being found in human form,*
⁸ *he humbled himself
and became obedient to the point of death—
even death on a cross.*
⁹ *Therefore God also highly exalted him
and gave him the name
that is above every name,
¹⁰ so that at the name of Jesus
every knee should bend,
in heaven and on earth and under the earth,
¹¹ and every tongue should confess
that Jesus Christ is Lord,
to the glory of God the Father.*

That which we can “give up” is nothing compared to that which Christ has given up for us. As the Apostle Paul wrote Jesus “emptied himself.” It does not mean that he somehow was no longer one of the three persons of the Trinity, but that he became fully human as well, becoming a slave to those for whom he came to save, taking on voluntarily all of the limitations of human existence. He felt the deepest of human emotions, the depths of human pain and immeasurable vulnerability. Paul sums this “giving” with the phrase, “He humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death- even death on a cross.”

As we begin our journey to Jerusalem during Holy Week, let each us be mindful of that which Christ gave up for us so that we may have life eternal- abundant life now and into God’s future. That which we may need to give up now will be inconsequential in light of eternity. Jesus gave his life so that we may be reconciled to him and have the honored place in his life as “friends.” Thanks be to God as we may experience giving up some things for a season, but receive the rewards of eternal life.

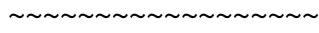
