Dear DPC Members and other Friends,

***“There is nothing better than a friend,  
unless it is a friend with chocolate.”***

While at times we may jest about friendships, one thing we can agree upon is that friendships are important. If not only from our own experience, scientific study after study, reports about the proven health, emotional and spiritual benefits of friendship. Historically, the Church has served as a place where deep friendships, sometimes life-long friendships, have been developed, nourished and sustained.

As culture has changed, so have the denotations and connotations regarding friendship. Now people are “friends” on social media in ways previously not imagined. In some cases, definitions have become so diluted, that one would not call that which is currently defined as “friendship”, a “friendship” at all. Others would defend the newer definitions of “friendship” as being just as true of friendships now, as any prior definition of friendships, especially if people were truly honest about the friendships they remember so fondly. Maybe they were not that healthy, or as close after all? Forty-four years ago, Jackson Browne wrote a song about the nature and definition of friendship, even as he was contemplating entering a new friendship that might eventually lead to romance. Through the lyrics, Browne asks some tough questions:

*Everyone I've ever known has wished me well  
Anyway, that's how it seems, it's hard to tell  
Maybe people only ask you how you're doing  
'Cause that's easier than letting on how little they could care?  
But when you know you've got a real friend somewhere  
Suddenly all the others are so much easier to bear*

*Now to see things clear is hard enough I know  
While you're waiting for reality to show  
Without dreaming of the perfect love, And holding it so far above  
That if you stumbled onto someone real, You'd never know*

*You could be with somebody who is lonely too (Sometimes it doesn't show)  
He might be trying to get across to you (Words can be so slow)  
When your own emptiness is all that's getting through  
There comes a point when you're not sure why you're still talking  
I passed that point long ago*

*I'm so tired of all this circling  
And all these glimpses of the end  
(You know it's useless to pretend)  
That's all the voices say "You'll go right on circling  
Until you've found some kind of friend"*

*Well I saw you through the laughter and the noise  
You were talking with the soldiers and the boys  
While they scuffled for your weary smiles  
I thought of all the empty miles  
And the years that I've spent looking for your eyes*

*Now I'm sitting here wondering what to say (That you might recognize)  
Afraid that all these words might scare you away (To break through the disguise)  
No-one ever talks about their feelings anyway  
Without dressing them in dreams and laughter  
I guess it's just too painful otherwise*

*It's like you're standing in the window of a house nobody lives in  
And I'm sitting in a car across the way (Let's just say)  
It's an early model Chevrolet (Let's just say)  
It's a warm and windy day You go and pack your sorrow  
The trash-man comes tomorrow  
Leave it at the curb and we'll just roll away...*

(The Late Show by Jackson Browne)

A final thought about friendships comes from the late Priest and author Henri Nouwen:

*"When we honestly ask ourselves which person in our lives mean the most to us, we often find that it is those who, instead of giving advice, solutions, or cures, have chosen rather to share our pain and touch our wounds with a warm and tender hand. The friend who can be silent with us in a moment of despair or confusion, who can stay with us in an hour of grief and bereavement, who can tolerate not knowing, not curing, not healing and face with us the reality of our powerlessness, that is a friend who cares."*

By God's grace, may Dunnellon Presbyterian Church remain a place where deep friendships are developed, nourished and sustained!


