### THOUGHTS AND WRITINGS FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear members and other Friends,

August 9<sup>th</sup> is a very special day in my life. It is not my birthday or the day I was married or either Debbie or one of my children or grandchildren's birthdays. It is the day on which I was ordained as a Minister of Word and Sacrament of the Presbyterian Church (USA.)

It was a special day at the Centre Presbyterian Church in Maxton, North Carolina. It was a hot and steamy day. I had yet to perfect the technique for chasing away the gnats from one's face by subtly blowing directed bursts of air from my mouth. I was still new, I sort of swatted at them without drawing too much attention to myself. Family had gathered from as far away as Texas and had increased the size of the congregation by 30% or so. I pretended they were all there for me, but it was really Anna Louise they had come to see as the cutest ever five-month-old.

This August 9<sup>th</sup> will be a special day. It will be forgotten by most, as it should be. I know one person not related to me that will remember that day and send me a card as she and her husband have for the last 20 years. There is no need to name names, because they know who they are, and as I said, I really don't expect anyone (other than myself and maybe my closest family) to even give it a thought. But I have been thinking about it a little bit more because it marks the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of speaking promises before a congregation and a Commission of Fayetteville Presbytery.

Thirty years-- many in this congregation were given an opportunity to retire with a pretty good pension; even a few of you received so-called "golden parachutes" a little before your 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary. I have friends who enlisted in the military who "retired" from the service 12 years ago and are well on their way to another 20-year retirement they will receive about the same time I retire. But the thirty-year mark of ordination has not been a catalyst to long to be retired, instead it has been an occasion for me to think about how much God still desires for me to do.

I will be in North Carolina on study leave when August 9<sup>th</sup> rolls around this year. My study focus is going to be upon looking at the future of Christianity in the western world, (especially the United States) and exploring what small part I may play in that saga. More specifically, I am going to be working on preparing some documents that may help us be organized as a congregation to deal with some dynamic shifts in culture that may come in the not so distant future. I will be using the resources of the seminary at Duke University and other area institutions to help me in my work, but most of my work will be simply to sit down and grind out some procedures that may help us move into our future more smoothly.

While I am on study leave I will also spend time in prayer- mostly prayers of thanksgiving for the gift that God gave me when I was ordained thirty years ago. I invite you to take some of your prayer time on August 9<sup>th</sup> (or the week of August 9<sup>th</sup>) and pray for our congregation, my ministry in your midst, for my family who share this thirty-year odyssey, and for yourselves as you contemplate the weeks, months, and years ahead of us and our ministry as Dunnellon Presbyterian Church.

## MUSIC

With the announcement that starting in September there will be one service held at 10:00 am approved by Session, we have been looking at the long-range goals of our music program. It is very clear to everyone that unexpected events have taken their toll on the choir over this past year, and it is my belief that by changing the rehearsal time from a weekday to Sunday mornings following the regular church service, it will give current choir members better opportunity to schedule their personal business and allow for church members who have wanted to participate but were unable to during the week to do so. We are planning on a "blended music" service. This means, the choir will sing an anthem on Communion Sundays, and special Sundays, while on other weeks they may act as hymn leaders only with no anthem that week. I plan on having time for quartets, solos, trios that will have a variety of music, from Sacred, Gospel to Contemporary on various Sundays. There will also be time for congregational participation on occasion; however, we need more singers to have a good program.

I hope that this change will encourage those of you who play instruments to also give us time for your talents. (If you can sing and play, that's even better!) The choir will not always have to rehearse every week once a monthly schedule is prepared and on most Sundays, we should be finished no later than 12:00 p.m. We can arrange for beverages and a snack available in the choir room for spouses or friends who can visit while the practices go on if this is something that is requested.

For those individuals who may not want to sit in the choir loft the entire Sunday, they can sit anywhere they wish, come up and join us for singing, then return to their seats. Some Sundays we will wear robes, sometimes we will not. However, I do expect those who want to sing to rehearse and be prepared. What is important, is that everyone can have the opportunity to be a choir member because we are already here for church, so why not??? We prayerfully ask you to consider joining the choir at our new rehearsal time, SUNDAYS, following a brief break after the regular service, beginning AUGUST 20th. Further developments of this new program will be announced. I will need to speak with any of you that are interested, so that I can

learn how we can place you in the voicing of the choir.

This is a new beginning to bring a joyous music program to DPC and we welcome you!

## MOVIES WITH MEANING

**August 5<sup>th</sup> at 2:00 pm**

DPC's Movies With Meaning on August 5th will feature Hospice of Marion County's showing of *Being Mortal*, a 2015 PBS Frontline special.

FRONTLINE follows renowned *New Yorker* writer and Boston surgeon Atul Gawande as he explores the relationships doctors have with patients who are nearing the end of life. In conjunction with Gawande's book, *Being Mortal*, the film investigates the practice of caring for the dying, and shows how doctors — himself included — are often remarkably untrained, ill-suited and uncomfortable talking about chronic illness and death with their patients.

Dr. Gawande's experiences and reflections, as well as those of his patients and their families, should spark a vital discussion on what we find important in our lives, especially when reminded of our mortality. Different families have different priorities. This discussion will be led by a hospice representative.

As a reviewer said about Dr. Gawande's book, *Being Mortal* is "not just about dying and the limits of medicine but about living to the last with autonomy, dignity, and joy."

As usual, the film starts at 2 p.m., followed by discussion. Drinks and snacks will be provided, and you are encouraged to bring friends or neighbors.
